What are native files?



A **native file** (or **secondary file** in DocBoss) is the version of a document in a secondary file format, typically the format of the program the file was created in.

Upload native and/or comment files

Managing and providing documents in your customer's preferred format is simple.



Track history of all files

Version history is saved automatically for all files, including the native and comment files.



Manage comment files

Did your customer provide a comment page in their submittal? [Identify](#) and manage it with ease.



Bulk process

Upload and assign native files to cards [in bulk](#) through automatic matching.
